

Commons Act 2006 - Schedule 2 (7) Application to deregister any other land wrongly registered as common land

Notice is hereby given that an application has been made by **Jonathan Beresford and Emma Louise Beresford** ("the Applicants") to Cumbria County Council as Commons Registration Authority, under Schedule 2 paragraph 7 of the Commons Act 2006 and in accordance with the Commons Registration (England) Regulations 2014.

The application relates to land at Angerton Hall Farm, Kirkby in Furness shown edged red, edged green and edged blue on the attached plan ("the Application Land") currently registered in the register of common land register unit CL87 Angerton Marsh.

A summary of the effect of the application is as follows: the Application Land was provisionally registered as common land on 12th December 1968 under section 4 of the Commons Registration Act 1965, pursuant to application number 169 (Land) made on 26th April 1968 by Kirkby Ireleth Commoners Association. The provisional registration, being undisputed, became final on 1st August 1972. The Applicants claim that immediately before its provisional registration the land was not: subject to rights of common; waste land of the manor; a town or village green within the meaning of the 1965 Act as originally enacted; or land of a description specified in section 11 of the Inclosure Act 1845(c.118).The Applicants claim that the Application Land was wrongly registered by Kirkby Ireleth Commoners Association and have requested the removal of the Application Land from the commons register.

If the application is granted, in whole or in part, the commons registration authority will give effect to the determination by deregistering the Application Land, which will entail the addition of a registration amendment entry in register unit CL87 confirming deregistration of parts, and the amendment or preparation of a fresh edition of the register map showing only the remaining land contained in register unit CL87 as common land and the Application Land marked as deregistered.

Any person wishing to make representations:

- must quote the Application No. CA13/37
- must state the name and postal address of the person making them, and the nature of that person's interest (if any) in any land affected by the application and may include an e-mail address;
- must be signed by the person making them;
- must state the grounds on which they are made; and

Any representations made will not be treated as confidential. To determine the application it will be necessary for the Commons Registration Authority to disclose information received to others, which will include the applicant and may include other local authorities, Government Departments, public bodies, other organisations and members of the public (Data Protection Act 1998). Representations may be disclosed upon receipt of a request for information under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 or the Freedom of information Act 2000.

The date on which the period for making representations expires is 6th June 2022.
