Application to amend the register to record an historic event

Notice is hereby given that an application has been made by **Thomas James Scott** ("the Applicant") to Cumbria County Council as Commons Registration Authority, concerning rights of common on CL17 East Stainmore regulated pasture, North Moor, described more fully below.

A summary of the effect of the application is as follows: The right to graze 37 sheep and their unweaned lambs over the whole of the land comprised in this register unit ("the Right") is currently registered as held in gross at Entry 2 of unit CL17. By an Assent dated 18 February 1987 all of the Right was transferred to the Applicant. The Applicant seeks by this application to register the Right in his own name.

If the application is granted, the registration authority will give effect to the determination by deleting the current entry and creating a new entry to show the Applicant as the owner of the Right.

Any representations made will not be treated as confidential, to determine the application it will be necessary for the commons registration authority to disclose information received to others, which will include the Applicants and may include other local authorities, Government Departments, public bodies, other organisations and members of the public (Data Protection Act 1998). Representations may also be disclosed upon receipt of a request for information under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 or the Freedom of information Act 2000.

The period for making representations expires at 5pm on 25 May 2018.
