NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR APPORTIONMENT OF RIGHTS OF COMMON
Secondary Application

Notice is hereby given that an application has been made by **Gillian Elaine Stuart** (“the Applicant”) to Cumbria County Council as Commons Registration Authority, under Section 8 of the Commons Act 2006 and in accordance with the Commons Registration (England) Regulations 2014.

The application relates to common land registers CL123 St. John’s Common.

A summary of the effect of the application is as follows: The right to graze 248 ewes and followers or 50 cattle or 25 horses or mixed equivalents and the right of cutting and harvesting bracken on St. John’s Common comprising the whole of the land in this register unit (“the Right”) is registered as attached to 52.555 acres of land at Bram Cragg Farm, shown on the accompanying plan as edged and hatched in blue and comprising O.S. fields numbered 813, 810, 817, 818, 819, 825, 820, 822, 821, 824, 826, 823, 849, 848, 850, 851, 852, 861 and 887 (“the Dominant Tenement”) at entry 46 of register unit CL123.

Part of the O.S. field 861 amounting to 0.187 acres and shown edged red on the accompanying plan is to be dedicated as public highway as part of a Highways Road Scheme. The Applicant seeks by this application to show that the portion of the Right associated with the part of the Dominant Tenement for which re-allocation is claimed, amounts to 0.88 ewes and followers or 0.18 cattle or 0.09 horses.

This secondary application can only be considered if the primary application (CA5/1) is granted. If granted the Commons Registration will give effect to the determination by creating a new entry in the register (making reference to the current entry) to show the proportion of the Right attached to O.S. number 861 as re-allocated to the rest of the Dominant Tenement.


Any person wishing to make representations:

- must state the name and postal address of the person making them, and the nature of that person’s interest (if any) in any land affected by the application and may include an e-mail address;
- must state the grounds on which they are made and must be signed by the person making them;

Any representations made will not be treated as confidential, to determine the application it will be necessary for the authority to disclose information received from you to others, which will include the Applicants and may include other local authorities, Government Departments, public bodies, other organisations and members of the public (Data Protection Act 1998). Representations may be disclosed upon receipt of a request for information under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 or the Freedom of information Act 2000.

The period for making representations expires at **5pm on 10th July 2020**
